

ORDINANCE NO. 13

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
THE LAKE ARROWHEAD COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT,
SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING
AND PROVIDING FOR THE ALLOCATION AND ISSUANCE
OF SEWER CONNECTION PERMITS.

WHEREAS, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, LAHONTAN Region, has issued a Cease and Desist Order to the Lake Arrowhead Community Services District effective September 8, 1983, limiting connections to the Lake Arrowhead Community Services District sewer system;

WHEREAS, this District must therefore establish a system of allocation of available sewer connections pursuant to the Cease and Desist Order:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Lake Arrowhead Community Services District as follows:

Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish a system of allocation of discharges to the sewer system pursuant to the Cease and Desist Order of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, LAHONTON Region dated September 8, 1983.

Section 2. RESUBMITTAL OF APPLICATIONS. That any and all applications for sewer system connection or sewer system discharge for which permits have not been issued will have to resubmit application dated October 1, 1983, or thereafter, for consideration by this District and in accordance with District Rules and Regulations, Ordinances, Resolutions and policies.

Section 3. ALLOCATION OF PERMITS. Due to the limitations

on sewer discharges imposed as a result of the Cease and Desist Order referred to hereinabove, this Board of Directors hereby establishes and adopts a priority and allocation system for the allocation for the issuance of permits to connect or discharge to the District sewer system as shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein. Any such permits issued will be in accordance with Exhibit "A".

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and is an urgency ordinance in order to protect the health and safety of the community by the control of unauthorized sewer discharges into the sewer system and as a result of the Cease and Desist Order referred to hereinabove.


Section 5. PUBLICATION. The Secretary is hereby directed to cause this Ordinance to be published once in full in a newspaper of general circulation.





The Public Hearing closed at 9:18 p.m.

The Board reconvened and discussed the comments made during the Public Hearing. With regard to the "Will Serve" letters issued by the former Sanitation District, the Board recognized it will be impossible to handle them in light of the Cease & Desist Order.

Mr. Hopkins suggested that a lottery or random selection be used for allocations rather than a first-come, first-served basis. Mr. Mauk requested the Board to take into consideration those homes under construction with a building and sewer permit in hand. He asked the Board to allow him time to make inspections before entering into a lottery. Mr. Hopkins stated that by the October 14th Board meeting he would prefer to allocate on a basis of priorities, including the general manager's comments, areas, and progress of construction.

Mr. Furness moved (2nd Wagner) adoption of Ordinance No. 13.

ORDINANCE NO. 13 - Establishing and Providing for the allocation and issuance of sewer connection permits; including "Exhibit A" as follows:

Four Year Connection Limitation

- 1. Projected connection application = 1,361
- 2. Discharge limit = 25,000 G.P.D.
- 3. Connection charge = \$2,571.00 per EDU

TYPE OF USE

LOCATION OF USE

(1) Public facilities	(1) W-1, W-2, W-3, W-4, W-5, W-6, W-10, WC-1 & E-1
(2) Single family residential	(2) Blue Jay area: W-7, W-8 & W-9
(3) Multiple residential	(3) East Shore area: E-2, E-3, E-4, E-5, E-6, E-7 & E-8
(4) Commercial - Industrial	(4) Grass Valley area: GV-1, GV-2, GV-3, GV-4 & GV-5

(Limit 2 EDU's per property)

Procedure:

- (1) Staff to review all applications for sewer service on file at close of each month
- (2) Staff to recommend allocation of sewer permits for each month by applying the above priority schedules as follows: 1st month = 41; 2nd month = 28; 3rd month = 28; 4th month = 28; commencing 10-3-83
- (3) Recommendation to be submitted to Board of Directors for their final approval of sewer permit allocations
- (4) All applications not issued in a given month will carry over to the succeeding month
- (5) Priorities to be reconsidered periodically as new information regarding capacity and corrections to the system take place
- (6) Allocation to be made on the basis of property (one application per parcel or lot)
- (7) Any time there is a failure in the system all allocations which have been allotted will go into a holding pattern until the failure is corrected
- (8) There shall be a period of time, not to exceed ~~45~~ days, between the date of allocation and the date the permit is issued
- (9) Allocations will not be on a first-come, first-served basis.
