

RESOLUTION 2016-13

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE LAKE ARROWHEAD COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT ADOPTING THE 2015 URBAN WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, the California Urban Water Management Planning Act, Water Code section 10610 et seq. (Act) mandates that every urban water supplier providing water for municipal purposes either directly or indirectly to more than 3,000 customers or supplying more than 3,000 acre feet of water annually, prepare and adopt an updated Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP) at least once every five years on or before December 31, in years ending five and zero; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to recent amendments to the Act, urban water suppliers are required to update and electronically submit their 2015 UWMPs to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) by July 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Water Conservation Act of 2009, Water Code section 10608 et seq. (SBX7-7), among other things, established requirements for urban retail water suppliers to prepare urban water use targets in accordance with the goals of SBX7-7 to reduce statewide daily per capita water use by 10 percent by the year 2015 and 20 percent by the year 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Lake Arrowhead Community Services District (District) is an “urban retail water supplier” for purposes of the Act and SBX7-7 because it directly provides potable municipal water to more than 3,000 end users; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable law, including the requirements of the Act and SBX7-7, the District has prepared its 2015 UWMP and has undertaken certain agency coordination, public notice, public involvement and outreach, public comment, and other procedures in relation to its 2015 UWMP; and

WHEREAS, as authorized by Section 10620(e) of the Act, the District has prepared its 2015 UWMP with the assistance of consulting professionals, and in cooperation with other governmental agencies, and has utilized and relied upon industry standards and the expertise of industry professionals in preparing its UWMP, and has also in part utilized and relied upon the DWR Guidebook for Urban Water Suppliers to Prepare Urban Water Management Plans, including its related appendices; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable law, including Water Code sections 10608.26 and 10642, and Government Code section 6066, the District made its Draft 2015 UWMP available for public inspection, caused to be published within the jurisdiction of the District at least two notices of public hearing regarding the District’s 2015 UWMP, on May 19, 2016 and May 26, 2016 in a newspaper of general circulation,

and provided notice of the time and place of the hearing, two of which dates were May 31, 2016 and June 7, 2016; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable law, including Water Code sections 10608.26 and 10642, a public hearing was held on June 14, 2016 at 5:30 p.m., or soon thereafter, in the Board Room of the District, located at 27307 State Highway 189, Suite 104, Blue Jay, CA 92317 to, among other things, provide members of the public and other interested entities with the opportunity to be heard in connection with the District's 2015 UWMP and the proposed adoption thereof; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said June 14, 2016 public hearing on the 2015 UWMP, the District encouraged the active involvement of diverse social, cultural, and economic members of the community within the District's service area with regard to the preparation of the 2015 UWMP, allowed input by members of the public and any other interested party regarding all aspects of the 2015 UWMP, allowed community input regarding the District's implementation plan for complying with SBX7-7, considered the economic impacts of the District's implementation plan for complying with SBX7-7, and confirmed Method 1 under Water Code section 10608.20(b) for determining its urban water use targets; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the District has reviewed and considered the purposes and requirements of the Urban Water Management Planning Act and SBX7-7, the contents of the 2015 UWMP, the documentation contained in the administrative record in support of the 2015 UWMP, and all public and agency input received with regard to the 2015 UWMP, and has determined that the factual analyses and conclusions set forth in the 2015 UWMP are supported by substantial evidence.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE LAKE ARROWHEAD COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

1. The District hereby confirms Method 1 under Water Code section 10608.20(b) for determining its urban water use targets, and the 2015 Urban Water Management Plan is hereby approved and adopted and ordered filed with the Secretary of the Board.

2. The General Manager of the District is hereby authorized and directed to include a copy of this Resolution in the District's 2015 Urban Water Management Plan.

3. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code sections 10621(d) and 10644(a), to electronically file the adopted 2015 Urban Water Management Plan with the California Department of Water Resources no later than July 1, 2016.

4. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code section 10644(a), to submit a copy of the adopted 2015 Urban Water Management Plan with the California State Library within thirty (30) days of this adoption date.

5. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code sections 10635(b) and 10644(a), to submit copies of the adopted 2015 Urban Water Management Plan, specifically including the portion of the Plan prepared in accordance with Water Code section 10635(a), to any city or county within which the District provides water supplies within thirty (30) days of this adoption date.

6. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, in accordance with Water Code section 10645, to make the 2015 Urban Water Management Plan available for public review during normal business hours not later than thirty (30) days after filing a copy thereof with the California Department of Water Resources.

7. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to recommend to the Board of Directors additional steps necessary or appropriate to effectively carry out the implementation of the 2015 Urban Water Management Plan in accordance with applicable law, including the Urban Water Management Planning Act and SBX7-7.


